Dear Residents, Commissioners and Staff:

Following the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DOH), and the Governor's direction, the Township staff has modified its operations over these past 16 months to protect the safety of our residents, public and staff, while continuing to provide essential services.

The East Pennsboro Township Community & Municipal Center Building will return to normal operations with some health and security upgrades when interior renovations are finalized at some point in early August. The Schaner Adult Center and the East Pennsboro Branch of Fredrickson Library will go back to full occupancy following the Governor's announcement on May 31st. All other services provided before the COVID pandemic will resume without social distancing restrictions. Residents and business owners are reminded that if an individual is not fully vaccinated, they are still required, and respectfully asked, to wear a mask while visiting Township offices or attending public meetings. Additionally, temperature screening of Township staff will also cease as of May 31st.

All public meetings will resume for in-person attendance beginning with the Planning Commission on Thursday, June 10th. The next regularly scheduled Commissioners meeting will be held in-person at the Township Building on July 7th. The Township will still allow interested parties to participate by calling into the meetings using the Township procedures available on the Township Website.

As a reminder, fully vaccinated people can:

- Resume activities without wearing masks or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance
- Resume domestic and international travel (unless required by the destination) and refrain from testing or self-quarantine before or after travel
- Refrain from testing and quarantine following a known exposure, if asymptomatic, with some exceptions for specific settings
- Refrain from routine screening testing if feasible

For now, fully vaccinated people should continue to get tested if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and follow CDC and health department travel requirements and recommendations.
